

About Toowoomba Concert Orchestra

Through and in music, we celebrate local musicians, respond to the community and inspire the future.

Toowoomba Concert Orchestra has been serving local musicians and audiences since its establishment in 1975. During this time the orchestra has been in residence at The University of Southern Queensland and since 2020 has found a home at The Empire Theatres Toowoomba. The Toowoomba Concert Orchestra is currently funded through membership fees and grants from Toowoomba Regional Council Community Access Fund.

The orchestra comprises volunteer local semi-professional and amateur musicians with a current full-time membership of 50+ musicians. We are led artistically by our Conductor and Musical Director who is paid an honorarium for their work and led organisationally by an executive and committee made up of fee-paying members.

Since its inception, the orchestra has produced many fine performances and projects focussing predominantly on music from the classical canon. Highlights of our work have included:

- Main stage performances with Aria winning Australian artists such as Josh Pyke and The Whitlams
- Performances with high calibre artists such as Benjamin Northey, Kate Miller-Heidke, LIST OTHERS HERE
- Performance collaborations with The Toowoomba Choral Society, Toowoomba Show Society,
- A schedule of annual children's and outreach concerts in collaboration with The Empire Theatre's Thrive on Arts festival

About our conductor:

Matthew Henry is the conductor and musical director of the Toowoomba Concert Orchestra (TCO) and through and his 17 years of service to this community organisation he has encouraged and inspired hundreds of musicians. His work with and leadership of TCO's membership has enabled them to present high quality concerts to a wide range of audiences both within and beyond Toowoomba including projects with Toowoomba Regional Council, The Empire Theatres, The University of Southern Queensland, Toowoomba Choral Society, and Toowoomba Show Society. Matthew is also regularly invited to encourage and conduct other musical projects.



He is a highly sought after music educator and in 2023 received Australia Day honours recognising his significant achievements and impact as the Culture awardee.
